EXECUTIVE DIPLOMA & PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION CERTIFICATE

The **United Nations Institute for Training and Research** and the **IUHEI Crans Montana Institute** aim to highlight the eminent role of Honorary Consuls in the diplomatic life and provide them, beyond an in-depth technical knowledge of their rights and duties, with the tools of a (1) real professional efficiency and the means for acquiring a (2) prestigious social recognition.

They therefore propose a specialized and high level capacity building program for **Honorary Consuls** associated to the issuance of an **OFFICIAL DIPLOMA** and **PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION CERTIFICATE**.

The Consular institution is sometimes viewed by practitioners alike as the poor sibling of diplomacy. That is totally ignoring the huge potential of consular instruments which offer multiple perspectives on the subject of diplomatic representation and the exercise of state sovereignty.

In this vein, the use of Honorary Consuls for selected bilateral relationships provides fresh insights into the study of international relations and diplomacy, particularly for small states.

This program will particularly help honorary consuls to discover how they can extend the bilateral diplomatic representation of their country often limited due to the constrained resources, enhance both its brand and international relevance and play an important role in its international economic relations.

Indeed, honorary consuls can contribute decisively to the international image of their country far beyond the classical functions of visa issuance and citizen services as example !

These extended functions encompass efforts notably in the public, social, economic and cultural diplomacy domains and such opportunities will help to make the role of the Honorary Consul more visible locally and to position him as a respected and essential actor in the public life and business.

THE HONORARY CONSUL PROMOTING THE IMAGE OF HIS COUNTRY

- Unlimited opportunities exist to create awareness about the Honorary Consul's country
- Main fields of activity : representation, development of economic, social, cultural and educational relations
- Replacing a diplomatic corps when absent
- Open and free discussion with experienced Honorary Consuls

ASSISTANCE TO CITIZENS

- The case of people unable or who cannot reasonably be expected to assume their own interests temporary financial distress
- Loss of passport or identity card establishment of provisional travel documents
- The case of illness or accident
- Assistance in case of death
- Deprivation of liberty: assisting and informing the imprisoned person about his rights of defense, ensuring that the right to humane conditions of detention, procedural guarantees and the rights of defense are respected

METHODOLOGY

Each module consists of pre-recorded lectures by experts and live sessions with heads of state, members of government, skilled diplomats and serving Honorary Consuls.

Participants can navigate through at their own pace and in their own time for maximum flexibility and learning comfort. Live sessions allow the exchange between participants and between participants and experts.

At the end of each Module workshop will be held consisting of 3 hours
